I became a Director of the Manitoba Dental Hygienists Association Board at the Annual General Meeting on June 5, 2006, and I was appointed President at the August 17, 2006 meeting. At this meeting Mary Bertone was appointed President-Elect, and shall take the reins in August 2007 as President of the MDHA for 2007-2008. Our fellow directors on the Executive of the MDHA Board were Kristin Carter as Past-President, Angela Rosales as Secretary, Diane Allard as Treasurer, Rolanda Pelletier as a Rural Director and the CDHA Representative was Carol Ann Yakiwchuk. Our student representative was Kim Dewar. Harriet Rosenbaum was the Executive Director. I would like to take this opportunity to thank them all for their hard work and dedication this past year.

I would like to acknowledge some of the events and courses of action which have occurred while I have been President. Through my term the MDHA has had membership on the Transitional Council through the Legislation Committee, which is chaired by Mickey Wener. Mickey Wener has also been established as sole Chairperson of the Transitional Council, as Barb Miller is no longer co-chair. The Transitional Council continues to work at ensuring that the College of Dental Hygienists of Manitoba becomes our legal regulatory body by January 2008. A Registrar and Board of Assessors for the College of Dental Hygienists of Manitoba (CDHM) should now be in place.

The Manitoba Dental Association has moved forward with the Preventive Dentistry Scaling Assistants. CDI College has graduated its first class, and an accreditation visit took place in February, 2007. Red River Community College will be offering a course starting February 3, 2007 to June 2, 2007 in which there are 12 students registered. The MDHA has struck a Scaling Module Committee, chaired by Angela Rosales, to develop strategies in order to ensure that Manitobans are receiving competent care from educated oral health professionals. The MDHA continues to have a representative, Cindy Niziol, on the Dental Assistants' Advisory Board at Red River Community College, and I am the representative on the CDI College Intra-Oral Dental Assisting Program's Advisory Board.

Harriet Rosenbaum, the Executive Director of the MDHA, gave her resignation to the MDHA Executive Board. The MDHA has greatly appreciated Harriet's dedication and hard work to the profession of Dental Hygiene in the Province of Manitoba and she will be missed. A search committee for the position of Executive Director of the MDHA has been struck which is being chaired by Rolanda Pelletier.

Our membership continued to promote dental hygiene in Manitoba, and the MDHA is very grateful for the hard work and dedication of its members. I would like to recognize some of the projects that our members undertook this year. Nicole Deaust and her volunteers partnered with Hot 103.1 and QX 104.1 to spread the word about proper nutrition and oral hygiene at the annual Boo at the Zoo. The MDHA's student members, under the guidance of Mickey Wener, hosted 'Soup Up Your Smile" as their annual outreach event in October.

LEGISLATION UPDATE – JUNE 2007

The MDHA Legislation Committee's activities continue to be focused on the goal of supporting the efforts of the College of Dental Hygienists Transitional Council whose goal is to bring The Dental Hygienists Act into effect for registration in January 2008. To date, the Transitional Council has undertaken the following activities.

Interim Registrar Appointed

We are very pleased to report that Kellie (Watson) Hildebrandt, RDH, MBA has accepted the position of Interim Registrar effective July 1, 2007. Kellie graduated from the University Of Manitoba School Of Dental Hygiene in 1995 and completed her Masters in Business Administration specializing in Health Services Management at the University of Saskatchewan in 2005. She has worked as a clinical dental hygienist in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta and held positions as a dental software consultant, coordinator with the Saskatoon Health Region and clinical instructor as part of the University of Saskatchewan Dental College Faculty. As well, Kellie is currently certified to instruct CPR, First Aid and AED training. She is currently living in Saskatoon, and will be relocating to Winnipeg this summer. Please join us in welcoming Kellie back to Manitoba in the inaugural position of Interim Registrar!

Board of Assessors

Following interviews in May & June, three dental hygienists will be selected to serve on the Board of Assessors, effective July 2007. These individuals will be reviewing all applications of dental hygienists seeking to be registered by the College of Dental Hygienists of Manitoba.

Applications targeted for fall 07

Look for application details via the next CDHM Communiqué/on-line and in your application package. In the meantime, to prepare for applying for the active practice register (planning to practice in the next year) and the non-practicing register (not planning to practice in the next year) some of the documentation you will need includes:

- Proof of graduation from an accredited dental hygiene program
- For all graduates on or after January 2007, documentation of passing the National Dental Hygiene Certification Examination
- Documentation of your practice history
- Liability insurance of \$3 million
- Current CPR

Continuing Competency

Once the College is up and running, a Continuing Competency Committee will be struck to develop a continuing competency program.

Scope & Supervision

Discussion and decisions to date significantly open up the public's access to dental hygiene services. Details will be forthcoming.

Registration Fees

All dental hygienists will pay a one-time application fee (\$75-100). Annually, registrants will pay a full fee for active practice (\$300-400), and a reduced fee for non-practicing registration. Student registration will be nominal. If you are practicing full-time or part-time, you will require an active practice registration. Note that the fees for the CDHM and MDHA/CDHA are separate.

Most recently, Harriet has been the Executive Director of MDHA from 2002 to the present. Although this was a paid position with MDHA, it paid for very little time. Harriet continued to invest much volunteer time with regards to this position and has move MDHA forward.

Harriet has always believed in giving a voice to Dental Hygienists of Manitoba and Dental Hygiene as a profession. She was always trying to get MDHA out there to bring her passion and knowledge to the public. She would often do outreach presentations to schools or health fairs and could be seen on A-Channel's Big Breakfast or heard on the radio on Hot 103.

I think it is more than evident that Harriet has given MDHA so generously of her time and expertise. Her drive for the profession is contagious and her support admirable. I think there are two things I personally will miss most about Harriet as she retires from MDHA council. First would be her sense of humour. Harriet always came flying (almost literally) into meeting between shuttling her kids to their extracurricular activities and attending her own. Harriet could always lighten a heated discussion during a meeting with a humorous, colourful comment that was always "off the record". But, I think the thing I will miss the most is seeing Harriet's passion for the profession of Dental Hygiene. She believes so strongly in what Dental Hygienists' do; their commitment to patients and their care, and to the potential for Dental Hygienists in the health profession.
