- MDHA forged partnerships with the University of Manitoba Faculty of Dentistry Continuing Education Department to offer jointly sponsored sessions, and with Find First Aid Inc. to offer CPR recertification courses to MDHA members at a reduced-cost.
- Six Continuing Education sessions were held this past year, including an event in Brandon. The MDHA Lecture Series has been created as an exclusive benefit to members.
- MDHA has made available oral health supplies and support to be used by members in any community outreach endeavors, and donated supplies to Rossbrook House.
- Promotional advertisements such as transit bus posters for Gingivitis Month and Alumni Faculty Bulletin ads were developed.
- MDHA has had unprecedented turnouts to meetings and events, including its highest Annual Mid-Winter Meeting turnout ever, with more than three times our previous best.
- Members promoted the profession, our organization and oral health at events such as Boo at the Zoo, the Brandon YWCA Young Women's Conference, National Dental Hygienists Week, and in newspaper articles that appeared in the Ottawa Citizen and the Edmonton Journal.
- MDHA made administrative changes including purchasing insurance to mitigate operations risk, and the creation of a reference MDHA Board Handbook for prospective Board members.

Wow, that's a full year! Thank you to the members who have helped make these, and the many other MDHA accomplishments, a reality. Thank you to the members who have given their time and energy to our association and who are now moving on to other goals; I wish you continued success in all that you take on. And to our new volunteers, welcome to "Team MDHA"!

Manitoba's LISTERINE GINGIVITIS MONTH PROMOTION INITIATIVE

Made possible through a grant from CDHA

Although more than 15 million Canadians have gingivitis, recent survey results suggest that only seven percent actually believe they have it¹. The Canadian Dental Hygienists Association, through its CDHA Listerine Gingivitis Month Promotion Initiative, provides an opportunity for interested dental hygienists, in their role as oral health promotion experts, to address this important issue. Individuals are invited to submit a proposal to how they plan to raise public awareness about gingivitis, with grants then be awarded to the top four applicants.

Why change a good thing? With last year's gingivitis bus poster campaign a resounding success, members Carol Yakiwchuk and Mary Bertone decided to think "green" by recycling and reusing their 2007 campaign idea. The popular bus campaign idea was once again chosen by CDHA and Johnson & Johnson Oral Health and with grant monies in hand, the poster artwork was quickly revised and printed for a June 1st start date to begin raising awareness on gingivitis and the important role Manitoba Dental Hygienists play in making oral health recommendations to the public.

Pattison Outdoor Advertising company created new 70" x 21" oral health posters, featuring a "brush, floss & rinse" message, the <u>www.gingivitis.ca</u> website, and the CDHA and MDHA logos. For the month of June, the posters were featured on 10 Winnipeg Transit city buses (an increase from 8 buses last year), whose routes changed daily to provide full city-wide circulation throughout the campaign that began June 1st, 2008. Again, a huge thank you to Shanlee of Pattison & Winnipeg Transit who expedited this project efficiently in record time, and who once again generously donated two additional weeks of promotion, extending the initiative to 6-weeks of exposure. This project, with a cost of \$1,994.30, offered the opportunity to reach out to more than 58,000 Manitobans each day of the campaign.

The BRUSH, FLOSS, RINSE regimen

In spite of the fact that two-thirds of Canadians are aware of the "brush, floss and rinse" regimen, more than half the public still don't follow the CDHA recommendations¹. An interesting recent finding is that Manitoba and Saskatchewan residents report the lowest use of rinsing in their daily oral care routine¹. Based on research conducted by Sharma et al. in 2004, we know that rinsing with an essential-oil containing mouthrinse is another evidence-based recommendation we can make.

What can you do?

Help clients select oral care products based that truly work and continue your excellent work in helping them understand the connection between inflammation of oral tissues and its connection with overall health.

It's your turn...

MDHA members, we're issuing you a challenge. You've got a whole year to come up with a great new idea to apply for the gingivitis promotion initiative grant. Think ahead, be creative, and let's continue to promote our profession and gingivitis awareness with CDHA.
