

In the days following the Run for the Cure there were concerns raised about hygienists who were not MDHA members being allowed to participate in an MDHA organized activity for PAR accreditation. Your Board heard your concerns and the following policy statement was adopted: "In 2013 the College of Dental Hygienists of Manitoba (CDHM) allowed participation in the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation(CBCF) CIBC "Run for the Cure" on Team MDHA Brush for the Cure (hereafter known as The Team), to qualify for accreditation as a Professional Activity Record (PAR) towards the CDHM Continuing Competency Program registration requirements. The Team is promoted and organized directly by the MDHA (under the umbrella of the CDHA teams); as such, participation on the Team will be a benefit limited to MDHA members, and their non-dental hygienist family members and friends."

Registration for the Team is done on the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation website and is not within the direct control and regulation of the MDHA. Starting In 2015 any hygienist not holding a current MDHA membership who registers to be on the Team will be informed via email that participation on the Team is for MDHA members only. Following the event a list of the MDHA members on the Team will be forwarded to the CDHM for PAR accreditation. Another benefit of MDHA membership!

MESSAGE FROM YOUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I have been working in a management position with non-profit associations for over 11 years and throughout that time I have had the privilege of working with a diverse group of people in a number of different types of organizations - regulated professions, trade associations, special interest and professional group associations. During this time period, it has become apparent that there is some confusion surrounding the differences between a Professional Regulator or College and a Professional Association. The differences are significant and I am hoping that this article will assist readers in understanding those differences and the unique roles of the College of Dental Hygienists of Manitoba and the Manitoba Dental Hygienists Association.

As you all know, dental hygiene is a self-regulated profession having achieved that status in 2008 after much government advocacy by the MDHA's elected board members and its Legislation Committee. The benefits of being self-regulated are many, including greater autonomy and control over your profession as well as professional recognition by others, to name a few. When a profession is granted self-regulation, they enter into an agreement with government, which gives the government some control over the profession, for the purpose of protecting the public, while at the same time allowing the occupational group to set the standards, rules and regulations by which all professionals must practice. Self-regulation allows the regulatory body, consisting of a member-elected Council, based on the current legislation, to set the entry requirements and standards for the profession rather than having another profession set those requirements.

To practice, Dental Hygienists in Manitoba must be registered in the 'practicing category' and meet certain requirements on an annual basis to ensure that they are competent to practice their profession. It is the responsibility of the regulatory body, as stated in government legislation, to set a process by which the competence of dental hygienists is evaluated on an ongoing basis. The requirement for continuing education helps to ensure that dental hygienists maintain a level of competency that contributes to public safety.

On the other hand, the MDHA is your Professional Association, the mandate of which differs greatly from that of the CDHM. While the CDHM must put public safety first and foremost, the work of the MDHA focuses on how to best serve its members. The MDHA offers a number of quality continuing education programs annually and it is partly through these programs that our members are able to meet their annual CCP requirements established by the CDHM. This is only one of the ways that the MDHA works in collaboration with the CDHM, with each considering the other as a professional "partner".

In addition to the professional development programming organized by the MDHA, we also have a mentorship program, providing much needed guidance to dental hygiene students who are the future of the profession in Manitoba. As well, MDHA supports a community outreach program that serves to promote dental hygiene and educate Manitobans on the importance of oral health for overall well-being. Some of the work done by the MDHA is visible to our members, while other work is done behind the scenes. Regardless of whether your Association's work is evident to you or not, rest assured that it is always done with the best interest of our members in mind. The MDHA will advocate on behalf of our members where appropriate, however, has no power or jurisdiction over employer/employee relationships, nor do we have any authority to change regulatory requirements as regulation falls under the authority of the College of Dental Hygienists of Manitoba.

The purpose of this article is to provide insight into the differences between the College and the Association, both of which are critical to the success of dental hygienists in Manitoba and we hope that we have achieved this to a small degree. The MDHA is here to serve our members and if you have questions at any time we welcome them and will do our best to provide you with a satisfactory answer.

Membership in your provincial Association also means that you are a member of the Canadian Dental Hygienists Association, which provides valuable resources to dental hygienists.

In Memory

The College of Dentistry and School of Dental Hygiene solemnly confirm the passing of Ms. Sheryl Feller on November 25, 2014. An alumna of the School of Dental Hygiene, Class of 1970, Ms. Feller was a 2014 recipient of the Alumni of Distinction award for her outstanding contributions to the profession and the community at large.



A long-time educator, administrator, management consultant and clinical practitioner, Sheryl Feller set several benchmarks both for women and dental hygiene professionals in Manitoba. She was the first woman in Manitoba to earn the Certified Management Consultant (CMC) designation and the first to serve as President of a provincial institute of CMC consultants. She was also the recipient of two entrepreneurship awards from Women Business Owners of Manitoba and the Distinguished Service Award from the Canadian Dental Hygienists' Association. Ms. Feller was also a gold medal graduate of the School of Dental Hygiene (1970).

The College of Dentistry and School of Dental Hygiene offer most sincere condolences to the family and many friends of Ms. Sheryl Feller.

Our beloved Tatyana Peleg has passed away at the age of 53, on Tuesday, December 2, 2014.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

2014-2015 Professional Development has begun. The opener, on October 20, was Oral Health Care During Pregnancy. Dr. Schroth gave a very informative session to 38 participants. **Did you know** that it is safe to diagnose, treat, take radiographs and to deal with immediate dental needs during the first trimester? That periodontal issues in pregnant women do not determine preterm low birth weights (April 2012, JCDA)? And that it is safe for pregnant women to take acetaminophen with codeine, amoxicillin and ASA (ASA only on a short term basis)?

Dr. Schroth emphasized that educating pregnant women on oral health is key to their overall health and well being.

The second lecture, on November 18 2014, was about Oral Candidiasis by the ever popular Dr. Perry (*right*). 27 people participated. **Did you know** that age, certain medications, decrease in saliva, systemic and nutritional disorders, tobacco smoking, and poorly maintained prostheses are some examples of predisposing factors to oral candidiasis? That a change in the management of the disease is that the Nystatin Oral Suspension is no longer swallowed but rather held in the mouth for 5 minutes 4 times per day? That Viaderm Ointment is the medication of choice for Angular Cheilitis?

Dr. Perry clearly stated that it is more important to identify and manage risk factors than to only manage the infection itself.



On November 3, Dani Bobtbyl (*right*) presented Part 2 of Contemporary Ultrasonic Instrumentation to a sold out audience of 16 people. This was a hands on lecture for participants who had taken Part 1 last year. Each participant was equipped with a Dentsply Cavitron, maniquin, several ultrasonic instruments, and a tooth with cement. We were fortunate to have the use of the lab on the second floor of the dental college. Dani tailored the experience to many of our questions and individual needs. Did you know that channeling is the advancing of the tip over the treatment surface in channels so that all segments are accessed? That insufficient stroking particularly overlapping strokes, is the principal cause of incomplete deposit removal?

November 4, Part 1 of Ultrasonic instrumentation was presented by Dani Botbyl to 22 participants. Dani presented an overview of ultrasonic instrumentation. She discussed the anatomy of the ultrasonic tip, how to select the right tip to get the job done, and how to adapt the tip to the root surface. She also recommended a book called Ultrasonic Periodontal Debridement theory and Technique by M George, TDonley and P Preshaw (2014). Like Dani's lecture, this book will definitely change your current perceptions about debridement with ultrasonics. **Did you know** that ultrasonic debridement is aimed at the definitive removal of biofilm and remaining calculus without intentional cementum removal and can be done to completion with ultrasonics? That high-volume evacuation has been shown to reduce the aerosol produced during ultrasonic instrumentation by more than 90%? Thanks so much to Dentsply for sponsoring this event. Look forward to their return next year, especially if you missed out this year or want to take Part 2 next year.

In Conclusion, there are still openings for the remaining two lectures. Sign up early for the Convention, we are having the amazing Jo Anne Jones from RDHU. Hope to see you!!
